Reading

Reading at home being the key to success in school. The message remains the same – read, read and read! Continue to practise your child's reading book over again to build fluency and to really embed those words into long term memory. If you have not yet done so, I would also encourage you to access the online reading book that is set for your child each Friday. Topic



Our topic this term is 'Our Wonderful World'. We will be finding out about plants and minibeasts as well as reading some stories set in Africa. Our topic will be enriched through a variety of books, including The Very Hungry Caterpillar, Baby goes to Market and Jack and the Beanstalk. Some of the exciting activities that we will be doing include growing beanstalks, watching a caterpillar grow into a butterfly, tasting fruits from Africa and going on minibeast hunts. We will also be working hard in our school allotment to grow our own tasty treats!

This term the children will also be learning about the past through some work about castles. Children will be dressing up as Kings and Queens, learning how castles were used in the past, naming the parts of a castle and acting out their own Coronation.



Maths.

This term children will be learning to name cubes, cuboids, spheres, cylinders, cones and pyramids. Spotting shapes of everyday objects at home, for example a baked bean tin or a stock cube, is a great way for children to practise this with you at home too.

Most children can now double to 5 + 5, and this term we will be learning to halve to 10. Using the 'one for you, one for me' method is a great way of doing this at home. We will be teaching the children that half means sharing something into *two equal groups* and that some numbers will have an *odd one left over*. This will lead us nicely into talking about numbers that are odd and those that are even.
